


ECU South West (BU)

ECC is **your pathway** to Edith Cowan University

ECC is a modern and dynamic educational institution providing high-quality programs in a supportive learning environment that encourages students to achieve excellence in their studies.

ECC offers a diverse range of programs including ELICOS and pathway programs leading into undergraduate and postgraduate degrees at ECU with advance standing.

Students will learn in a multi-award winning environment and achieve through highly engaging learning and teaching activities with practical hands-on skills and industry based training.

Why choose ECC?

Gain direct entry to ECU

ECC diploma programs are based on first year units of the equivalent ECU bachelor degree programs. As our diploma programs are moderated by ECU, you can be confident that your program is of the highest quality. Students who successfully complete the diploma program are eligible for direct entry into the second year of the respective bachelor degree at ECU.

One visa for all your studies

As a ECC student, you can apply for a single visa to cover the duration of your studies. Under this visa you can package your ECC program, your degree at ECU and your English language program (if required).

Flexible trimester (three semester) system

Through ECC's innovative trimester system, you can fast-track your studies and complete a program in only eight months. Part-time enrolment options are also available to Australian students.

Small class sizes and individual attention

Lecture groups have a maximum of 50 students, although most average between 25 and 35 students. Lectures are complemented by group tutorials and workshops, ensuring you receive a high level of attention from your teachers.

Longer teaching sessions

As part of our supportive approach, ECC provides more teaching hours per unit of study than the university. Instead of the traditional three hours of teaching at university, ECC conducts its classes in four-hour blocks, Monday to Friday.

Study accredited programs

ECC is registered by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) which is Australia's regulatory and quality agency for higher education. It is also a government-approved Registered Training Organisation (RTO) under the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) for the provision of vocational education and training courses.

Located on ECU's campus

ECC is located on the Joondalup campus of Edith Cowan University. The Joondalup campus is within a five minute walk from the Joondalup train station, with a free bus service available to take you directly to the campus. ECC's Certificate IV, diploma and PQP programs are taught on the Joondalup campus. ECC's English language programs are taught on ECU's Mount Lawley campus.

Deciding on your preferred course of study is an exciting challenge. ECC offers a broad range of programs at pre-university (Certificate IV) and university level (Diploma) in the fields of Business, Communications and Creative Industries, Hotel Management, Science (Computing/IT), Science (Engineering Studies) and Science (Health Studies).



Certificate IV Tertiary Preparation Program (TPP)

The Certificate IV Tertiary Preparation Program (TPP) is a nationally recognised pre-university level program that is equivalent to Year 12 at an Australian secondary school.

Students who have successfully completed Year 11 or equivalent are eligible to enter this program. On successful completion of the Certificate IV (TPP) students will be eligible for entry into the relevant ECC diploma program.

Tertiary Access Program (TAP)

The Tertiary Access Program (TAP) is a non-award program designed to transition students who have completed Year 12 (or equivalent) but do not have the necessary academic background or grades for direct entry into the diploma program. This program consists of four modules of study in the first trimester and requires a minimum of 50 percent pass in all four modules in the first trimester to progress on to the diploma program.

Students are required to complete Introduction to Computing plus Communications Skills II plus two stream modules in one trimester to qualify for entry to the diploma.

Diploma programs

ECC's diploma programs are equivalent to the first year of an ECU degree program. They are designed, delivered and moderated by qualified university lecturers on the ECU campus, in smaller classes with longer teaching sessions. Upon successful completion of a ECC diploma, students are eligible for entry into the second year of the related ECU degree program.*

Post-Graduate Qualifying Program (PQP)

The Post-Graduate Qualifying Program (PQP) is a one semester non-award program designed to lead students into Edith Cowan University (ECU) masters degrees. The program is designed for students who already have tertiary qualification but have not qualified for direct entry into university masters programs.

Teaching and assessment

ECC's units are conducted in a classroom setting during four hour teaching blocks from Monday to Friday.

Methods of assessment may differ depending on the program and subjects you choose. Most subjects will be assessed through a combination of written examinations and assignments, essays, oral presentations, seminars and tutorial participation. Some coursework will include group-based projects and practical workshop activities. For each unit, students receive an outline that includes due dates for the completion of assignments. Students are prepared for ECU by learning about the same referencing systems, academic integrity rules, academic writing skills and penalties for late submission. Attending all classes is essential in order to be successful at ECC.

ECC reserves the right to cancel classes due to insufficient demand. Please note, some modules/units are offered in alternate trimesters.

Your student life on campus

At ECC we recognise the importance of meeting our students' personal and academic needs. To achieve this priority, we have outlined below the services and programs offered to all students to make your journey as enjoyable and successful as possible.

Orientation program

A comprehensive orientation program is provided for all new students before the start of each trimester. It includes:

- interactive campus tour where you have the opportunity to make new friends from different nationalities
- meetings with staff and student leaders
- assistance with module/unit selection and course advice
- ECC email account and internet access via the e-lab and free Wifi
- transport information
- text book information
- information about OSHC membership
- participation in a workshop to set you up for academic success
- information on accessing the Student Handbook, Student e-café (support information), ECC website and student portal

Academic support

Each trimester, course coordinators are available to help students who need additional English language, study or computer support while undertaking a ECC program. Free online seminars will

help you improve your study skills, time management, presentation and exam preparation skills.

Student portal

ECC's student portal is a web-based resource developed to assist ECC students during their studies. It contains important information such as unit outlines, course materials, examination timetables and results, re-enrolment details, e-café (study support resources), student news and reminders. The ECC student portal can be accessed at edithcowancollege.edu.au

Student wellbeing

Adjusting to a new environment can be a stressful experience for many students. The student counselling service is available to provide support. All discussions are kept confidential.

Our student support program links new students with senior ECC and ECU students, who can offer advice on everyday matters about living and studying in Australia. All new students are assigned a student leader to help them during the first few weeks after their arrival.

Social activities

ECC students are welcome to join ECU sports teams and participate in any on-campus social activities, which are a great way to meet new friends. Regular events include:

- social sports events
- excursions and adventure activities in association with CISWA (Council for International Students WA)
- Student barbecues and social gatherings
- plays and concerts

Medical services

As a condition of a Student Visa, international students must purchase and maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) while studying in Australia.

OSHC fees paid to ECC will be transferred directly to Allianz Global Assistance, our preferred provider.

As well as ECU's on-campus medical service, international students covered by OSHC have access to 24 hour toll-free telephone emergency services, which includes medical, legal and interpreting services.

OSHC does not cover any medical condition that is pre-existing before you enter Australia.

Airport pick-up and transfer

International students first arriving in Australia can book a free airport transfer to their accommodation. Please contact your accommodation provider at least seven days before your arrival in Australia to confirm your airport pick-up and transfer. IELTS test centre

ECC has been appointed as an official IELTS testing centre in Western Australia, and conducts IELTS tests on the Mount Lawley and Joondalup campuses. For more information about IELTS testing at ECC, visit ielts.org or edithcowancollege.edu.au/ielts

Accommodation

There are several accommodation options available while you study at ECC. You should start planning your accommodation six to eight weeks before arriving in Australia.

Students under 18 years of age

As well as meeting all requirements for a student visa, if you are under 18 years of age, ECC must approve all your welfare and accommodation arrangements.

If you are younger than 18 and plan to stay with a friend or a relative outside your immediate family, you must receive permission to do so from your parents and ECC. If you do not have a friend or relative to stay with while at ECC, we recommend homestay accommodation.

Homestay

Homestays are a popular accommodation option for overseas students as it gives you the opportunity to live with an Australian family while you study. Each homestay host has been screened to provide good-quality facilities and meals in a friendly environment where you can live, relax and study in comfort and security, while improving your English language skills.

On-campus accommodation

ECC students have access to on-campus accommodation at the ECU Mount Lawley Student Village which features five-bedroom apartments just a short walk from the university. The apartments are modern and fully furnished with private bedrooms, bathrooms, large kitchen and lounge areas, so students will have plenty of space to hang out with friends. On-site facilities include a pool, café, sound lounge, e-library, study zones and shared laundry.

Off-campus accommodation

Off campus options include house/flat rentals or hostels. Costs vary considerably depending on the size, quality and location of the accommodation. Renting normally requires a contract of 6-12 months and one month's rent in advance, as well as a refundable deposit (bond) to cover any damage to the property during the rental period.

Airport Transfer

To assist you with your arrival in Perth, ECC provides a free airport reception service for new students studying English followed by a ECC pathway program or students directly entering a ECC pathway program.

ECC utilises two companies to arrange airport reception for students. This service is available through Perth Student Accommodation (PSA) or Australian Homestay Network (AHN). If you would like to be met at the airport and taken to your accommodation, please complete the application form available on the website of the company you wish to use as soon as you have your flight details.

Perth is the vibrant capital city of Western Australia and has a population of over 1.8 million people. Climate

Perth offers a Mediterranean-style climate with warm, dry summers and mild winters. It is the sunniest capital city in Australia and has an average of eight hours of sunshine each day.

Things to see and do in and around Perth

- Perth has some of the most pristine coastline in the world; in the metropolitan area alone there are over 80 kilometres of white sandy beaches with clear blue water – ideal for swimming, surfing, sailing and fishing.
- Perth's newest entertainment precinct 'Elizabeth Quay' connects the city back to the Swan River.
- The Perth Arena hosts live entertainment, music and sports events throughout the year. The state of the art venue has a capacity of over 15,000 and attracts international artists from around the world.
- Every February the city hosts the Perth Festival, the longest running annual international multi-arts festival in the Southern Hemisphere.
- Kings Park is one of the largest inner-city parks in the world (larger than New York's Central Park) and home to Australia's largest wildflower show and exhibition.
- During the summer, locals enjoy relaxing with a picnic of great local wine and cheese at one of seven outdoor cinema complexes.

Further afield

- Rottneet Island, located 18 kilometres off the coast, is Western Australia's very own island getaway featuring picturesque scenery and some of the world's finest beaches and bays.
- World class surfing waves can be found in Western Australia's Margaret River region, which is also home to some of the world's most acclaimed wines.
- Stretching almost two kilometres out to sea, the Busselton Jetty south of Perth is the longest (and oldest) wooden jetty in the Southern Hemisphere. It is also listed as one of the top 10 dive sites in Australia.
- Just 30 minutes from Perth is the Swan Valley, Western Australia's oldest wine-growing region, the ideal destination for the gourmet traveller.

Choose your program

Business

This program will provide you with an overall perspective of business processes and fundamental business skills. Business degree programs at ECU have a large practical skills focus and are designed in consultation with industry, professional bodies and government organisations.

The ECU component provides students with the opportunity of workplace integrated learning through a 16 week full-time industry internship program (unpaid) upon transferring to ECU.

Specialised units in the Bachelor of Business degree – Business Edge Program

We believe in the importance of developing your employability skills to better prepare you for your future career in the workplace. So we introduced ECU Business Edge – a program of three units across the duration of the degree, covering vital employability skills, which are core to the Bachelor of Business degree.

Employability skills are a range of skills, behaviours and attributes, commonly referred to as generic or 'professional' skills, and are essential if you want to be 'career-ready' when you graduate.

Our teaching is student-centred and incorporates role plays, scenarios, interactive multimedia and activities to enable you to develop your employability skills by 'doing' – the most effective and enjoyable way to learn. Business Edge units are taught in purpose-built classrooms with enhanced technology to allow you to work with your peers on real-world problems.

Communications and Creative Industries



The Post-Graduate Qualifying Program (PQP) is a one semester non-award program designed to lead students into ECU's master degrees. The program is designed for students who already have tertiary qualifications but have not qualified for direct entry into university masters programs.

The program will equip students with graduate knowledge, skills and English Language Proficiency (ELP) for entry into masters degrees in the School of Business and Law at ECU.

Your English language preparation

ECC provides English language programs for people from non-English speaking backgrounds and direct entry pathways for international students wishing to undertake university study at ECU and elsewhere.

ECC is renowned for its excellent teaching staff, high quality programs and outstanding facilities. Students have access to a wide variety of student services, support and activities, with the added advantage of interaction with Australian and international students studying degree courses.

The teachers at ECC are qualified and experienced in teaching English as a second language and many have taught overseas. They use a variety of teaching methods combined with a wide range of modern materials and resources to encourage active learning.

English language programs


ECC offers the Academic English Program (AEP) which is designed for students who plan to study at an Australian University or who are interested in developing academic reading, writing, listening and communication skills.

The AEP is offered in 10 week blocks (offered every 5 weeks) with nine fixed start dates per year and is taught on ECU's Mount Lawley campus.

Following successful completion of the required academic English level, students will not be required to take an English test for entry into ECC / ECU (excluding programs where IELTS is compulsory, such as Nursing).

The pass mark for each 10 week block of Academic English is 65%. The teaching times are Monday - Friday and students are placed in either a morning class or afternoon class.

Your admission requirements

The minimum English and academic requirements for entry to ECC's Certificate IV, Diploma and PQP programs are outlined on pages 20–23. ECC has established minimum English and academic requirements for its programs; however, each application will be assessed on its individual merits.

Not all qualifications or countries are listed, so if you have other qualifications you should attach certified transcripts to your ECC application form. The college can make conditional offers based on forecasted or preliminary results where appropriate.

Mature-age entry

Mature-age students (aged 20 or above) may be admitted to a program without meeting the formal academic qualifications. You will need to provide evidence of relevant work experience and other acceptable qualifications or background when submitting your application.

Credit transfer

Students with recognised tertiary studies may be eligible for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) (also known as exemptions). Please provide certified copies of your academic transcript and subject syllabus. For more information visit edithcowancollege.edu.au/exemptions

English language requirements

International students must be able to demonstrate their English language proficiency before they enter a ECC program. (Note: IELTS is compulsory for Nursing courses). The college may also ask selected students to take the Pearson Versant Test to demonstrate their English proficiency at no extra cost. If you do not meet the English language requirements for your chosen program, you may be able to enrol in an English language program.



FEE-HELP - important information for Australian students

FEE-HELP is an Australian Government loan scheme for eligible, full-fee-paying students to help pay all or part of their tuition fees. The scheme is open to any student who is an Australian citizen and is studying with an eligible higher-education provider such as ECC.

A student may pay a maximum of \$99,389 (indexed at 1 January each year) in tuition fees using FEE-HELP over their lifetime, depending on the programs they undertake. Students repay their loan through the tax system once their income is above the minimum threshold for compulsory repayment.

If you are eligible for FEE-HELP you will receive a 'Request for FEE-HELP assistance' form with your letter of offer. To guarantee your place at ECC, you will need to complete and return this form to ECC before your course commences.

Note: FEE-HELP is only available to eligible ECC students who are enrolling in diploma programs.


